BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN

Hopefully you've begun saving your change for those baby bottles for the start of the campaign on January 19th. In case you don't know much about the campaign, it is a fundraiser for Pregnancy Resources Plus. They offer of three main services: pregnancy testing, limited ultrasound and Building blocks. (The campaign raised funds for the new ultrasound machine a couple of years ago.) The Building Bocks Exchange allows expectant parents to take classes on parenting, finance, etc. and earn credits toward baby supplies at the PRP store. They offer Bible studies and classes for post-abortion patients and post-miscarriage patients. All services are provided at no cost. This year funds are being raised to re-pave the parking lot that is estimated to cost \$10,000. Please save your change for this worthy campaign!

HOPES GREAT AND SMALL

"The Christian lives with three hopes, two great and one small," writes Bryan Wolfmueller. In his "Wednesday What-Not" blog, the pastor explains: "Our first great hope is in Christ our Redeemer, whose death and resurrection are our forgiveness, life, salvation and great hope. Our second great hope is in Christ the King returning soon to judge the living [and] the dead, and establish the new heaven and earth where the righteous dwell. This is our hope for the resurrection and the life of the world to come."

Amazingly, there's more! "Sandwiched between these two great hopes is our small hope, our lesser hope, our hope for tomorrow, our hope that we might begin to love and serve our neighbor, and do some little something to bless the people around us," Wolfmueller continues. "This is the hope that energizes our vocations, that motivates our love, and that is the reason we make New Year's resolutions. We hope that we might do something a little bit better tomorrow than we did yesterday."

The pastor concludes, "If this was our only hope, it would be despair. But sandwiched between the love of Christ and the joy of the resurrection, this little hope is wonderful, and certainly not to be despised."

GOD'S CONSTANT NEW WORK

From the beginning of time, God's pattern has been to continually do new things and make things new. Though we can celebrate this every day, the New Year's season is especially fitting to pause and recognize God's work of renewal. - You will be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will bestow. (Isaiah 62:2)
- [God's] compassions ... are new every morning. (Lamentations 3:22-23)
- I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you. (Ezekiel 36:26)
- [Jesus] took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you."
 (Luke 22:20)
