The mission for May & June is the Joint Seminary Fund. The LCMS Joint Seminary Fund was established to supplement the Synod subsidy by directly soliciting the church for charitable donations. Gifts to the LCMS Joint Seminary Fund are restricted exclusively to supporting both of our world-class seminaries. Our LCMS seminaries have only three sources of operating revenue: 1) Investment income from endowment, 2) Tuition paid by students after financial aid is awarded (often in the form of student loans), & 3) Financial gifts graciously supplied by God's people.

The **Potluck Dinner** for the Lutheran Hispanic Missionary Institute was held after church on April 24th. About 20 people attended. We collected \$162 for the Institute at the dinner. Next month I will report on what the total giving for the Institute was, as well as for the Dollar Project.

The Story Behind Stone Soup

Some travelers come to a village, carrying nothing more than an empty cooking pot. Upon their arrival, the villagers are unwilling to share any of their food stores with the very hungry travelers. Then the travelers go to a stream and fill the pot with water, drop a large <u>stone</u> in it, and place it over a fire. One of the villagers becomes curious and asks what they are doing. The travelers answer that they are making "stone <u>soup</u>", which tastes wonderful and which they would be delighted to share with the villager, although it still needs a little bit of <u>garnish</u>, which they are missing, to improve the flavor.

The villager, who anticipates enjoying a share of the soup, does not mind parting with a few carrots, so these are added to the soup. Another villager walks by, inquiring about the pot, and the travelers again mention their stone soup which has not yet reached its full potential. More more villagers walk each adding another ingredient. by, like potatoes, onions, cabbages, peas, celery, tomatoes, sweetcorn, meat (chicken), milk, and pepper. Finally, the stone (being inedible) is removed from the pot, and a delicious and nourishing pot of soup is enjoyed by travelers and villagers alike. Although the travelers have thus tricked the villagers into sharing their food with them, they have successfully transformed it into a tasty meal which they share with the donors.
