FROM THE PASTOR

For our boast is this, the testimony of our conscience, that we behaved in the world with simplicity and godly sincerity, not by earthly wisdom but by the grace of God, and supremely so toward you. 1Corinthians 1:12

Some of you are like me, we have been Lutheran ever since we were born. We grew up in the Lutheran church. I started out in the American Lutheran Church (ALC) up through 2 years of confirmation classes. It was then that my Dad observed what was being taught and not being taught and kept me from taking the third year of confirmation classes to confess my desire to join the church.

Our family didn't attend church much in those years after that. Yes, the ALC was headed down the wrong road when it came to the scriptures. It eventually led to what is now the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) which only claims that the Bible only "contains" the Word of God and not that the Bible "IS" the Word of God.

Since I have always been "Lutheran" I have had to learn from my own study and the study of others as to why I see Lutherans, especially the Missouri Synod Lutheran Church is the Church that most closely holds to the scriptures in belief and practice.

I enjoy hearing from others who have made the rounds when it comes to churches and in the end find themselves in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. What did they hear, see, experience that brought them to the Lutheran Church especially the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod?

One of the most concise videos of a person's journey to Lutheranism and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod is a video by Pastor Bryan Wolfmueller as he recalls what led him and his wife to the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. On your computer or device search: "Wolfmueller Why I'm a Lutheran" to get the short YouTube video where he explains the path he and his wife took that ended up with he and his friend Pr Dr. Brian Kachelmeier both becoming Missouri Synod Lutheran pastors.

This discussion came up in the men's Bible study last Wednesday as we were looking at the seven churches in Revelation. John writes what the Lord gave him to write and as he addresses these churches, he first is led to write something that the church addressed is doing well but then there is what they are not doing so well.

One might say: "Just because they don't believe like we do, does that mean other churches of our day aren't Christians?" No, it doesn't mean they aren't Christians. But anytime someone or some church deviates from the pure Word, then there is always that area of belief, doctrine, that tugs at the what the scripture actually says.

If you watch the video, Pr. Wolfmueller will explain his experience well and helps us to put into words why you and I are Lutherans but like the 7 churches of Revelation, we aren't perfect either and need to look at ourselves when it comes to the pure faith we have been given.

Then the questions is, "Why are you Lutheran?"

WE REMEMBER

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.

EVANGELISM

Tract of the Month: "You've got questions about gender and about sexuality. BIG QUESTIONS. Questions that aren't easily answered. Is gender binary or fluid?
