FROM THE PASTOR

<u>Psa. 139:16</u> Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them.

Bellow is the position statement of Lutherans for Life: In vitro Fertilization (IVF)

WHEREAS, God is the Creator and Giver of life and has provided human beings with the ability to procreate; and

WHEREAS, Medical science has attempted to assist persons with the procreative process by developing methods by which multiple human embryos may be produced, preserved, and implanted for continuing development; and

WHEREAS, Although such methods may help persons who had been unable to conceive naturally to conceive and bear children, inherent within such methods at the present time is **the loss of life—as not all the embryos produced survive—and potential for the necessity of making decisions to dispose of unused, excess human embryos; and (emphasis mine)**

WHEREAS, Lutherans For Life recognizes the pain of childlessness and that some people, desiring to have children, have used *in vitro* fertilization without realizing or considering the potential consequences for the embryos involved; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life at the present time objects to and opposes the use of *in vitro* fertilization; and be it further

RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life does not condemn those married couples who have used *in vitro* fertilization but encourages ministry to them and to all people such that they may receive the comfort of Christ and His redeeming love.

As we look to elections coming up, you may have heard about IVF from the candidates. Looking at the above position statement of which I am in agreement, many do not know the with the current procedure to obtain eggs from the woman, many eggs are produced to be fertilized. Those eggs which are fertilized, are looked at and some are discarded, some implanted in the uterus of a woman and others are usually frozen.

I don't know if there has been much study on the frozen embryos over time and the affects of that freezing on them.

Each egg that is fertilized is a unique human being. No, it is not a part of the woman's body but is a separate individual. The Lord sees each embryo as one who He has seen even though it would take a microscope to see him or her.

Neither presidential candidate is seeing the embryo as a life that should be protected but is only looking to the couple and their desire for a child. Much more needs to be done in the future ie. the ability to only obtain 1 or 2 eggs at a time to eliminate the need to throw away embryos or to freeze them.

Yes, we feel sorry for those who can't have children but we don't need to see their lives and desires take precedence over the life of the child.

The headline in an <u>Israel Today</u> article dated August 3, 2020, read "Israeli Rabbi Holding Meetings With Messiah".

The article stated Rabbi Yaakov Zisholtz was told by Rabbi Chaim Kanievsky that he is already in direct contact with the Messiah. Rabbi Kanievsky is considered to be one of the top three rabbis of the ultra-Orthodox Jewish community in Israel.

Rabbi Zisholtz began his explosive interview with the warning: "The process of redemption is about to start happening very quickly and at a fast pace. It is important that people remain calm and steady to act properly in the right time." He goes on to state "Everyone needs to know whether they are on the inside or if they are going to be left out."

Why is this important to us? Is this claim valid? In light of the various conflicts happening in the world today, lots of commentary I have read clearly states that a lot of people really want for JESUS to return NOW.

JESUS words in Matthew 24:36" But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, But the Father only.", we should be skeptical of any man's claims to be talking to the MESSIAH.

However, the warning about being ready for the return of JESUS rings true. The parable of the ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom reinforces our need to be ready for HIS return. Are you one of the wise virgins whose lamp is full of oil and you have extra in case the bridegroom is delayed? Or are you like the foolish virgins whose lamps were empty when the bridegroom arrived and were locked out of the wedding feast?

According to the Lutheran Study Bible, Matthew 25:3, footnote, the oil represents a faith continually sustained by the means of grace, thus able to endure until CHRIST's return.
